

Projected Pupil Premium Spending 2013/14

Overview

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to publically funded schools in England. It was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years. Looked after children and children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces are also entitled to Pupil Premium funding. The Pupil Premium is used to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and to close the gap between them and their peers.

In the 2013 to 2014 financial year, schools will receive:

£953 for each eligible primary aged pupil who have been:

- registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- in care for 6 months or longer

The Vision for Pupil Premium in our school

At Chorlton Park Primary School we are using our funding in three main areas:

1. To achieve academically: to raise attainment and progress
2. To participate in a range of experiences
3. To develop skills for success in life

How we will measure the success of pupil premium allocation.

1. The percentage of pupils eligible for PPG achieving L4 English and Maths combined compared to non PPG pupils and the national average for all pupils
2. The percentage of pupils eligible for PPG making 2 levels progress compared to non PPG pupils and the national average for all pupils

We also ensure that all of our PPG children will by the end of Year 6:

Chorlton Park Pupil guarantee

- Will receive quality ICT provision
- Will receive quality music provision
- Will receive quality sports coaching
- Will attend the Year 4/Year 6 residential visits

Statistics

In 2013/14 there are 171 children eligible for Pupil Premium funding. This equates to approximately 27% of the school population.

The profile of our Pupil Premium children are as follows:

Each year group has a similar number of children entitled to Pupil Premium, apart from Year 6, who have a larger proportion of eligible pupils.

This year, our Pupil Premium allocation for these pupils is £154,200

Provision

In order to meet our vision, we will ensure that a range of provision is made which meets the needs of all pupils. All our work through the Pupil Premium will be aimed at accelerating progress; initially this will be in Literacy and Numeracy. Evidence shows that children that achieve Level 4 are more likely to succeed at GCSE. We aim to move as many individuals as possible to at least age related expectations and for many of our pupils, we are aiming to stretch them further than this.

This year we are using the Pupil Premium funding to provide:

- Additional Teachers in Years 2 – 6 and EYFS to provide targeted support for pupil premium children in class
- TA training and interventions including ‘5 Minute Box’ and ‘Write Away’
- Mathematics Booster groups in Year 2 and Year 6 taught by our Mathematics lead teacher
- English Booster groups in Year 6 taught by our English lead teacher
- Specialist IT staff
- Philosophy for Children training – to extend and deepen children’s questioning skills and understanding
- Small group and One to one tuition
- Social & Emotional aspects of learning groups
- Speech and Language Therapist – to deliver programmes and provide training and support
- Attachment training for all staff
- Attendance monitoring and support, including the funding of a Parent Support Advisor
- Training and development in effective marking and feedback for teachers
- Support with funding residential trips
- Support with funding Music tuition and Wider Opportunities music provision

As a result of the additional funding, these children will make better progress and

achieve higher standards that would have been likely without it.

Reporting

The Head teachers and school Leadership Team will regularly evaluate and review our strategies we have put into place and produce regular reports for Governors outlining:

- The progress made towards narrowing the gap,
- An evaluation of the effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision.
