The Primary PE and Sports Premium funding that is received by the school annually is used in a variety of ways in order to promote:

- good quality physical education
- healthy active lifestyles
- competitive School Sport

### **Good Quality Physical Education**

1. Invested in a dance curriculum programme used in Nursery up to Year 6. This exposes our children to a wide range of dance styles that become progressively more technical as they progress through school. This programme provides demonstration, guidance and plans that ensure high quality teaching.
2. Employing a specialist coach to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in delivering physical education.
3. Investment in professional develop that will ensure high quality physical education teaching for the whole school.

### **Healthy Active Lifestyles**

1. To engage with the least active children in through a Change 4 Life Club. Staff to attend training to support them in facilitating this.
2. Employing a specialist coach to work with lunchtime staff to ensure children have the opportunity to participate in sport and playground games at lunch times.
3. Allocating some of the funding to provide resources for lunchtime sport and games.

### **Competitive School Sport**

1. Paying staff and sports coaches to organise pupil participation in national school games competitions.
2. Joined the Manchester PE Association in order to increase pupil participation
3. Purchased equipment to enable school to host competitions.
4. employing a specialist coach to provide weekly afterschool sport.
